

East Sussex College Financial Support Summary 25/26

These guidance notes should be read in conjunction with application and the 2025-2026 Student Support Fund Policy and Procedures, which can be obtained from our website or Student Services. The College is given specific allocations of funding to provide assistance to learners studying on a course funded by the Education & Skills Funding Agency. Learners should apply early as the funds do run out. Applications will be dealt with on a strict date received basis and this is dependent on all applications being fully completed with all the required evidence. Incomplete applications will be marked as incomplete/awaiting evidence on the online portal.

Please note that eligibility does not mean that an award will be made as the funds are limited and will close when fully allocated. No guarantee can be given that funds will be available when you apply. If there is a high demand on the funds, awards may be made at a reduced rate. Subsequent payments (where paid) may be at a lower rate if there is a high demand.

Funds will only be released once learners have enrolled and started their course. Initial awards will normally be made within 4 weeks of the course start date or from date of receipt of application whichever is the latter. For loan students, awards will only be made once an approved loan is in place and student has passed the loan liability point (2 weeks).

Please be aware that if learners leave their course early, the college may ask for the return of any payments made or kit/uniform that has been purchased with the funds.

Learners on 2-year courses will need to re-apply for subsequent years and criteria and awards may differ.

Free Further Educations Meals

Eligibility	 As at 31 August 2025 be over 16 and under 19 years of age or aged 19 – 24 and have an Education, Health and Care Plan or aged 19 and continuing on a study programme they began aged 16 to 18 (19+ continuers) AND Be studying on a funded course funded and leads to a qualification (up to Level 3) that is accredited by Ofqual AND Student or parents in receipt of eligible benefits: Income Support Income – based Jobseekers Allowance Income – related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 The guarantee element of State Pension Credit Child Tax Credit (provided that they are not entitled to working tax credit) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190-00, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Custom. Working Tax Credit run – on – paid 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit Universal Credits with net earnings not exceeding the equivalent of £7,400 per annum (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
How much can I get?	Meal to the value of £2.61 per day you are in college
What does the funding cover?	Meals whilst in college
How is it paid?	You will be able to use you Student ID card to purchase food in the various college outlets
Additional Information	 No change will be given if you spend less than £2.58. You can choose to spend more than £2.61 – you will need to pay the difference

Eligibility	 As at 31 August 2025 be over 16 and under 19 years of age or aged 19 – 24 and have an Education, Health and Care Plan or aged 19 and continuing on a study programme you began aged 16 to 18 (19+ continuers) AND Be studying on a funded course funded and leads to a qualification (up to Level 3) that is accredited by Ofqual AND In receipt of eligible benefits (See free meals)/Household income (Earned Income & Income related benefits) of £38,500 or less Demonstrate a financial need to help with participating in education
How much can I get?	• Amount awarded depends on individual costs of attending college. It is important to note that the fund is limited. See summary of awards table/policy.
What does the funding cover?	 To support students towards the cost of travel including work placements, compulsory books, equipment, uniforms, compulsory visits, and materials. Eligibility	 Over 16 and under 19 years of age on 31 August 2025 AND Be studying on a funded course funded and leads to a qualification (up to Level 3) that is accredited by Ofqual AND in care or leaving care OR in receipt of Income Support or Universal Credit in their own name OR in receipt of BOTH ESA/UC AND Disability Living Allowance/ Personal Independence Payments in their own name
How much can I get?	• Up to a maximum of £1,200 per year, calculated on actual need & cost
What does the funding cover?	 To support students towards the cost of travel, compulsory books, equipment, uniforms, visits, and materials For travel you take advantage of all discounts and concessions. (Calculated using Google maps walking distance)
How is it paid?	 Monthly payments direct to student's bank account or credit to college account where applicable. Full details will be on the award letter
Additional Criteria	 Payment will be based on 85% attendance at College or at work placements and acceptable behaviour and conduct. Payments may be withheld or reduced if attendance falls below 85%

Eligibility	 Be under 20 years old on the first day of your course Is the main carer for the child Living and studying in England & Course qualifies Childcare provider qualifies and is OFSTED registered If you have more than one child, you can get help for each of them Other Conditions may apply
How much can I get?	Up to £180 per child per week if you live outside London
What does the funding cover?	 Childcare while you are learning, on work experience and industry placements which are part of your programme of study or doing private study as agreed Childcare deposit and registration fees (T & Cs apply) Summer retainer if you are returning to the college in the next academic year to study an eligible FE course. (T & Cs apply) Additional travel costs you have to pay so you can take your child from home to the childcare provider
How is it paid?	Childcare paid monthly direct to childcare provider on receipt of invoice

For level 3 courses, student must be 19 – 23 studying their first full level 3 qualification on the list of entitlements or 19+ studying a L3 course which is part of the Free Courses for Jobs L3 adult offer AND under the Earnings threshold. AND In receipt of eligible benefits (see free meals)/Household income (Earned Income & Income related benefits) £38,500 or less AND Demonstrate a financial need to help with participating in education
